#### Supplementary methods:

## Variant classification.

*DYSF* transcripts ENST00000258104.7 and NM\_003494.4 were used for all analyses. The pathogenicity of 176 variants from dysferlinopathy patients referred to our diagnostic laboratory was re-evaluated according to the ACMG/AMP criteria<sup>1</sup> with the modifications described in the Supplementary methods. The variants analyzed in this study are listed in the Supplementary Table S1. The detailed information about the lines of evidence used for variant classification are provided in the Supplementary Table S2. The Supplemental Table S3 lists variants that were re-interpreted as Benign, Likely benign or VUS (variant of uncertain significance). Forty novel variants were submitted to DYSF-LOVD. We also corrected the outdated classifications of variants in our set.

We applied the PVS1 criteria according to ClinGen Sequence Variant Interpretation (SVI) recommendations for Interpreting the Loss of Function PVS1 ACMG/AMP Variant Criteria<sup>2</sup>. When attributing PVS1 to splice variants, presence of cryptic splice sites around the variant was explored using Human Splicing Finder<sup>3</sup> (https://www.genomnis.com/access-hsf). PS3 score was assigned for variants with a minigene result "Impact on splicing" in Kergoulay *et al.*<sup>4</sup>. This code was downgraded to PS3\_supporting for c.565C>G variant since only a trace amount of abnormal transcript was observed in the minigene assay with persistent presence of normally spliced transcript<sup>4</sup>. We applied PP3 score (*in silico* prediction of pathogenicity) if CADD or REVEL score were above 25 and 0.7 respectively. REVEL scores<sup>5</sup> were obtained from https://sites.google.com/site/revelgenomics/downloads and CADD scores<sup>6</sup> from https://cadd.gs.washington.edu/snv, using GRCh37-V1.6 model. HSF<sup>3</sup>,MaxENT<sup>7</sup> and SpliceAI<sup>8</sup> were used to assign PP3 for non-canonical splicing variants using the default thresholds. SpliceAI scores were also obtained for all missense variants in order to identify variants with a possible impact on splicing (no above-threshold variants identified, data not shown). PM3 score (in *trans* with a pathogenic variant) was assigned according to the SVI Recommendation for in *trans* Criterion PM3 (Version 1.0,

https://www.clinicalgenome.org/site/assets/files/3717/svi\_proposal\_for\_pm3\_criterion\_-

\_version\_1.pdf). PP1 score (segregation data) was assigned according to the recommendations by the Hearing Loss ClinGen Working group that focused in part on recessive disorders<sup>9</sup>. The thresholds for the allele frequency criteria were as following: PM2 - 0.02%, BS1 - 0.5%, BA1 - 5%. The POPMAX Filtering Allele Frequencies were obtained from gnomAD v2.1.1<sup>10</sup>. Since clinical presentation of all patients in our cohort was suggestive of Dysferlinopathy (progressive muscle weakness with evidence of proximal or distal muscle involvement confirmed by biopsy or EMG), supporting strength PP4 code was assigned to all rare variants associated with a second pathogenic or likely pathogenic variant. This code was not applied if the variant in question was associated with two pathogenic variants that fully explained the dysferlinopathy phenotype. A moderate strength code (PP4 moderate) was assigned when dysferlin protein was completely absent in muscle tissues or monocytes (as detected by western blot or Immuno-Histo-Chemistry) and the variant in question was associated with a Pathogenic or a Likely pathogenic variant. PP4\_moderate code was not assigned if only a partial decrease of Dysferline protein was observed. If the studied variant was associated with two pathogenic variants, PP4\_moderate code was not assigned. Indeed, in this case it cannot be ruled out that the absence of the protein was caused by the other two pathogenic variants rather than by the presence of the variant in question. PP4 codes were only assigned to rare variants (PM2 also attributed). PM1 criterion was not used since the functional domains of dysferlin are not devoid of benign variation. BP1/PP2 codes were not used since both benign and pathogenic missense variants are present at high frequency in DYSF gene. PP5 and BP6 were not used following the recommendations by ClinGen SVI Working Group<sup>11</sup>.

Data analysis and visualization was performed with R 4.0.3 using the collection of tidyverse packages (v.1.3.0, https://www.tidyverse.org/) and the ggforce package (v.0.3.2). Classification summaries shown in the Supplementary Table S2 were generated by automatic extraction from individual files

containing data for a given variant using an Excel VBA macro. Visualization of variants on the *DYSF* gene structure in the Figure 2 was done with ProteinPaint<sup>12</sup> (https://pecan.stjude.cloud/proteinpaint), using the domain positions described by Sula *et al.* <sup>13</sup>.

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Supplementary Figure S1: The numbers of different types of *DYSF* variants identified in dysferlinopathy patients referred to the Medical Genetics Department of Marseille.

Hundred and seventy-six unique variants have been identified in dysferlinopathy patients and returned as pathogenic at the moment of diagnosis since the beginning of diagnostic sequencing of *DYSF* gene at the Medical Genetics Department at La Timone Hospital in Marseille, France – 96 protein-truncating (PTV) and 80 non protein-truncating (non-PTV) variants. Protein-truncating variant group is composed of 35 nonsense variants, 46 frameshift inducing indels and 15 variants with splice impact leading to a frameshift. The non-PTV group consists of 60 missense variants, seven in-frame indels and 13 variants with impact on splicing but leading to inframe splice alterations. Four indel PTVs and 2 indel non-PTVs also had an impact on splicing (listed as "indel" in the Supplementary Table S1 and in Figure 1B). The variants analyzed in this study are listed in the Supplementary Table S1. The detailed information about the lines of evidence used for variant classification is provided in the Supplementary Table S2.
